

Public Education—The Record of the two Parties Contrasted.

The Chronicle has of late stated that the public schools in North Carolina were not as efficient as they ought to be made, and we have always believed that the reason was to be found chiefly in the fact that in the poverty of the people they have not felt themselves able to pay sufficient taxation to maintain schools that would afford the best instruction.

Resolved, That the next General Assembly of North Carolina is requested to increase the fund for the maintenance of public schools.

Let us briefly examine the record of the two parties in North Carolina in regard to public education. Upon their record on this important question the people ought to judge them.

At this time the date of the fiscal year was changed and we have only the partial expenditure. From Nov. 30th, '88 to June 30th, '89—seven months—the expenditures were \$523,849.17. From June 30th, '89 to June 30th, '90 the expenditure for public schools amounted to \$718,225.00.

Thus it will be seen that the Democrats have regularly increased it and the next Legislature is pledged to increase it, and to make the schools better. The men who have the management of our public school system from wise, conservative and progressive Superintendent Finger, Lecturers Alderman and McJeyer to and including the Local Superintendents and Boards and School Committees, are putting new enthusiasm into the public school work.
