Salmon P. Chase: "My agency in procuring the passage of the national banking act was the greatest financial mistake of my life. It has built up a monopoly that offends every interest in the country. It should be repealed. But before this can be accomplished, the people will be arrayed on one side and the banks on the other in a contest such as we have never seen in this country."

Abraham Lincoln: "Monarchy is sometimes hinted at as a possible refuge from the powers of the people. It would be scarcely justified were I to omit expressing a warning voice against returning to despotism. It is the effort to place capital above labor in the structure of the government, I bid the laboring people beware of surrendering a power which they now possess, and when surrendered their liberty will be lost."

John C. Calhoun: "Place the money power in the hands of a combination of a few individuals and they by expanding or contracting the currency may raise or sink prices at pleasure, and by purchasing when at the greatest depression and selling when at the greatest elevation, may command the whole property and industry of the whole community. The banking system concentrates and purges this power in the hands of those who control it. Never was an engine favored better calculated to place the destinies of the many in the hands of the few."

Abraham Lincoln said in 1865: "Yes, we can all congratulate ourselves that this cruel war is drawing to a close. It has cost a vast amount of treasure and blood. The best blood of the flower of American youth has been freely offered upon our country's altar that the nation might live. It has indeed been a trying hour for the republic, but I see in the near future a crisis arising which unifies us and causes me to tremble for the safety of my country. As a result of war, corporations have been authorized and an era of corruption in high places will follow, and the money power of the country will endeavor to prolong its reign by working upon the prejudices of the people until all wealth is aggregated in a few hands and the republic is destroyed. I feel at this time more anxious for the safety of my country than ever before even in the midst of war. God grant that my fears may prove groundless."
