The Conference Platform. The following is a correct copy of the platform adopted at St. Louis by the labor conference:

Sec. 14. The Federal Government should care for and improve the Mississippi river and other great water ways of the republic so as to secure for the interior States easy and cheap transportation to the tide water.

Sec. 15. For the purposes of National defenses and the promotion of commerce between the States, we recognize the early construction of the Nicaragua canal and its protection against foreign control as of great importance to the United States.

Sec. 16. Recognizing the World's Columbian Exposition as a National undertaking of vast importance, in which the general government has invited the co-operation of powers of the world and appreciating the acceptance in many of such powers of the invitation extended and the broadest liberal offer's being made by them to contribute to the grandeur of the undertaking, we are of opinion that Congress should make such necessary financial appropriation as shall be requisite to the maintenance of the National honor and public faith.

GRANITE. Having found that for all stone quarries, granite, marble, slate, etc., is in constant demand, we have established a granite quarry near Washington, D.C.

FINANCE. 1. We demand a national currency—safe, sound and flexible—issued by the general government only; a full legal tender for all debts, public and private; and without the use of banking corporations; a just and equitable means of circulation, at a tax not to exceed two per cent, as set forth in the sub-treasury plan of the Farmers' Alliance, or some better system; also, by payments in the discharge of its obligations for public improvements.

Sec. 17. Popular education being the only safe basis of popular suffrage, we recommend to the several States more liberal appropriations for public schools. Free common schools are the nursery of good government, and they have always received the fostering care of the democratic party, which favors every means of increasing intelligence.

Sec. 18. We approve the action of the present House of Representatives in passing bills for the admission into the Union as States of the Territories of New Mexico and Arizona, and we favor the early admission of all Territories having necessary population and resources to admit them to Statehood and while they remain Territories we hold that officials appointed to administer the government of any Territory, together with the District of Columbia and Alaska, should be bona fide residents of the Territory or District in which their duties are to be performed.
