The Conference Platform. The following is a correct copy of the platform adopted at St. Louis by the labor conference:

1. We demand a national currency - safe, sound and flexible - issued by the general government only; a full legal tender for all debts, public and private; and without the use of banking corporations; a just and equitable means of circulation, at a tax not to exceed two per cent, as set forth in the sub-treasury plan of the Farmers' Alliance, or some better system; also, by payments in the discharge of its obligations for public improvements.

2. Your sub-committee upon the land plank, beg to submit to your approval the following: The land, including all natural resources of wealth, is the heritage of all people, and should not be monopolized for speculative purposes, and alien ownership of land should be prohibited.

3. Transportation being a means of defence and public necessity, the Government should own and operate roads in the interest of the people.

Instructions to Railway Travelers.

Children over five (5) and under twelve (12) years of age travel at half fare.

Ticket agents are expected to furnish tickets if called for, and are not allowed to advise passengers as to choice of routes beyond their own lines.

A limited ticket is not good for passage after the date of limitation has expired. This does not affect passengers on the train, provided they had started before the date of expiration.

When you reach your destination show your unexpired ticket and receipt to the ticket agent. He will either get instructions from the management or return the unused ticket at once, or will forward the ticket to the proper authority, and you will receive notice of the issue.

Checking Baggage. Railway regulations allow 15 pounds of baggage to each full ticket. Baggage is not allowed to check baggage and they have an animal you ticket.

Sleeping Cars. Sleeping car accommodations are always extra fare, and rates are fixed upon double berths, section and drawing room occupied by one or more passengers.

Providence S. S. Convention. The Providence Township Sunday School Association met to-day in Trading Ford Baptist church.

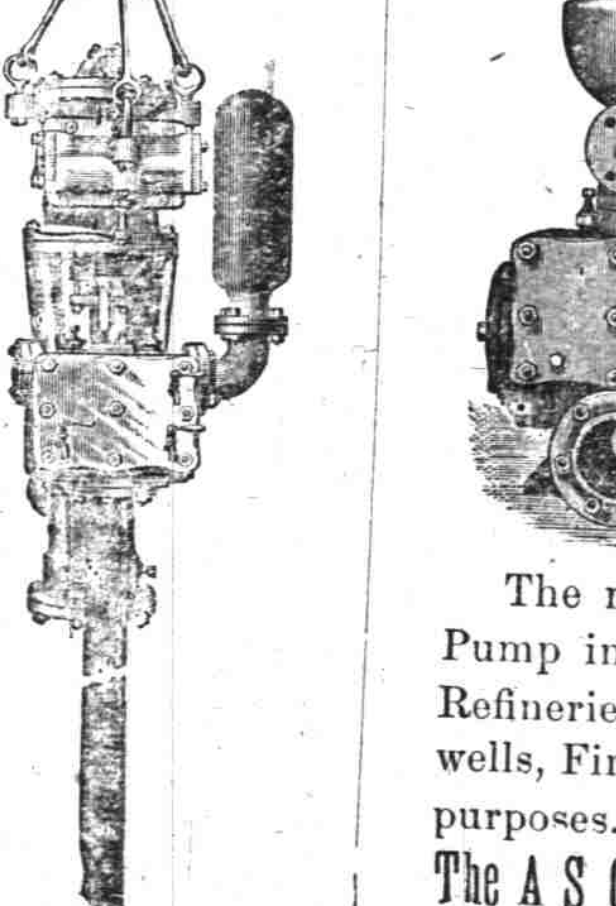

The president has issued a proclamation designating Friday, October 21st, as a general holiday, it being the 400th anniversary of the discovery of America by Columbus.

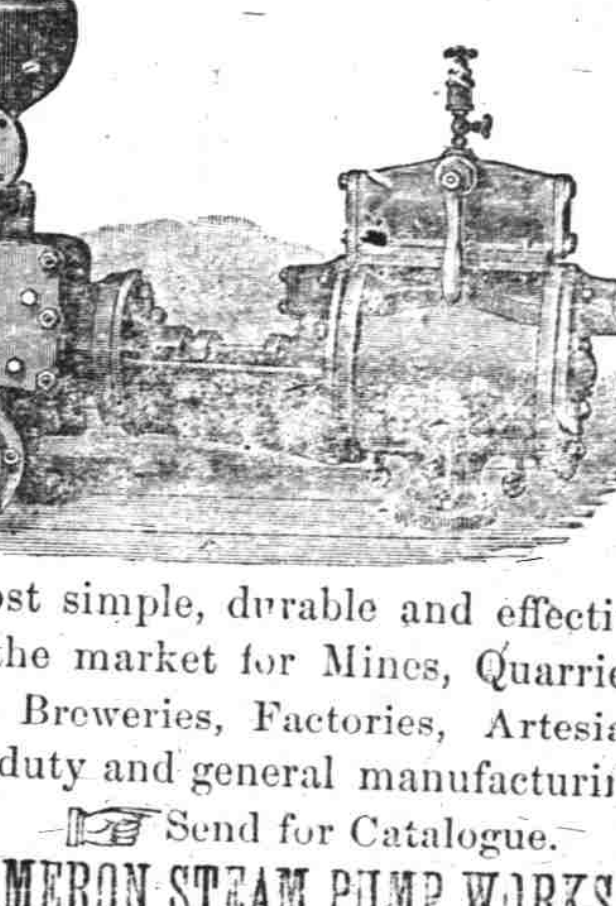
The average ministerial salaries in the United States is \$700. Dr. Morgan Dix, of Trinity, gets \$25,000 and Dr. Talmage \$12,000.
