d. We believe that the money of the freasury sh and he kept as much as possible in the hands of the people and hence we demand all National and State revenues shall be limited to the necessary expenses of government. economically and honestly administered. e. We demand that Postal Saving

banks be established by the government for the safe deposit of earnings of the people and facilite exchange.


