## The Penitentiary Farm.

On the farm on the north side of the Roanoke there are about 2,900 acres, and on the South side about 2.200 acres, From 500 acres in cotton they will get 350 bales; from 1,500 acres in from 150 acres in peanuts they saved 3,000 bushels. They made 1,100 gal-

000 pounds of pork. On the Caladonia farm near Tillery Mr. Pope's estimate was that from 500 acres of cotton they will get 300 bales: from 1,500 agres in peanuts they will gather 8,000 bushels.

On the farms near Halifax there are 300 convicts, many of whom are leaning and ditching. On both these farms the river has been dyked so that to ordinary freshet will injure the crops
