A Big Liverpool Cotton Fire.

Liverpool, Jan. 6-Three cotton varehouses on Juniper street were burned last night with 11.000 bales of eou on. The loss is \$170,000. The walls f one warehouse bulged out and fe pon a party of firemen, killing threand seriously injuring a number o thers. The fire was ve y stubbon and the wreck is still burning.

The fire, which was confined within the walls of the three warehouses, parmed itself out at about 2 o'clo-k his afternoon. The salvage will be rifling. It is now said that there were 20,000 bales of cotton in the building at of which was destroyed. It was the ergest fire that has occurred in Liverpool since the burning of the landing stage in 1874. It is believed that te ire was smoldering among the cotton or hours before it was discovered. The cotton was stowed close to 18 walls, and when the water soaked into the bales it caused them to swell great-, and this, it is thought, had much to lo with the wall falling upon the fire-

Bg E'enhant's Death From Sval wing a Chain

An autopsy, remark ble in itself and with surprising results, was held yesterday at Baraboo, Wis., on the indy of the mammoth elephant "Zip," that lied a few nights ago in winter quarters there. Prof. Donaldson of the Chicago University and Prof. Akally. of Milwaukee, performed the autopsy to ascertain the cause of the big pachyde m's death. Althoughflong of the most tractable disjosition, Zp. three lays preceding his death, had been in state of continued frenzy, scaring the kangaroos and other animals at the quarters into spasms. Another peculoss of appetite.

The autopsy was performed in one and of the quarters especially curtained off, to prevent the other elephants from seeing what was going on.

A sharp knife was first drawn through the tough skin under the stomach the entire length of the anmal, and then the hyde deftly removed. An incision was then made in the stomach, and Prof. Donalden, wh was wielding the scalpel, uttered ar exclamation of surprise.

"There cer ainly cannot be a bone in the elephant's stomach," he said, 'and yet the knife strikes something apparently as hard as iron."
