

HOW TO RAISE CORN.

Mr. W. H. Glasscock, of Brunswick, Mo., has this to say about raising a v-ry large crop of corn: "The variety is called the 'Missouri Cross.' This year it produced 102 bushels and 45 pounds, weighing from 55 to 57 pounds to the bushel, and this is the way 1 made it: Plowed the ground very early and when I got ready to plant I re-plowed it one inch deeper than the tirst plowing. The sixth day of June 1 followed with a spring tooth harrow in front of a checkrow cuitivator: cultivated four times, and when in tassel and silk topped every other row on an acre and this produced 102 45-56 bushels. On a plat of not quite four acres I produced 365 bushels. So you can easily see that the topping process is good. The parent varieties are the white mammoth and yellow dent." 
