St. Swithun lived in the ninth century. He was chaplain to King Egbert, futor of Alfred the Great, and died bishop of Winchester. He was buried in the churchyard of the cathedral. They made a saint of him and built a shrine to his memory in the cathedral. When this was finished it was resolved in 971 to remove his remains from the churchvard and reinter them in the shrine.
