A Good Opportunity.

The United States Civil Service Commission will hold an examination in Raleigh on July 30 and 31, for the purpose of examining applicants for appointment in the Indian Service. Following is a list of the positions in the Indian Service with the salaries attached to each: (1) primary teachers, \$300 to \$600 per annum; (2) advanced primary teachers, \$600 to \$720 per annum; (3) principal teachers, \$720 to \$900 per annum; (4) superintendent, \$1,200 to \$2,000 per annum; (5) matrons, \$500 to \$720 per annum, a few paying less than \$500.

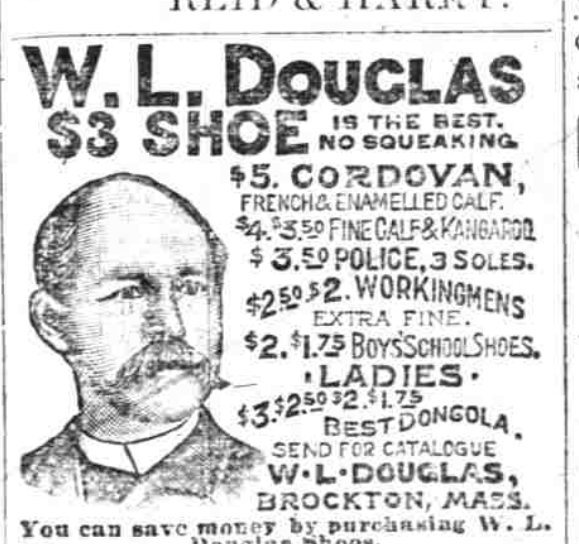
