Senator Overman has introduced a bill looking into the possibility of extending the sale of the cotton products of the United States in all the markets of the world. A very good idea.

It is good news to the friends of J. P. Caldwell, editor of the Charlotte Observer, to learn of his continued improvement. He has been confined to his room for several weeks with typhoid fever and is now said to be out of danger.

The United States Supreme Court has decided that your uncle Sam may tax the South Carolina dispensary just as though it was a private affair. It does business for money and should pay as others do. We do not always agree with the Supreme Court boys, but they do seem to hit a thing right occasionally.

Mocksville has recently organized a city improvement and development association, and among the good things she is offering as an inducement to manufacturers, is a tax rate of 25c on the hundred dollars, 1/2 of one per cent. This is indeed a remarkably low rate, and, like a number of other smaller towns that are crowded with factories and industrial enterprises, this item will be a considerable inducement in securing such institutions. The wise town will see to it that this figure is not materially increased. DEATHS.

WEDDINGTON, Mrs. A. L., of Concord, died at the Whitehead-Stokes sanatorium Friday night. Mrs. Weddington was brought here a few days before for treatment but it was an useless task as there was no hope of her recovery. She was a wife of only one year and a mother of only two weeks. Her remains were shipped to Concord Saturday where the interment took place.

MAUNEY.—The six-months old child of Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Mauney, who have been living at Old Fort for the past two years, died here Monday night, shortly after reaching Salisbury. The child had pneumonia and was brought here for treatment, but too late. The remains were taken to Gold Hill, Mr. Mauney's old home, where the interment will take place to-day.

GRUBB, CRAMER.—This is the young man who was so badly injured between some cars, at Spencer Saturday one week ago. From the time he was injured there was no hopes of his recovery, but he lingered till Wednesday morning when he died. Mr. Grub was just 17 years of age and an orphan. He was a young man of many good traits and though he had been at the shops only a short time, he had made many warm friends, who with his relatives will learn with sorrow of his untimely end. His remains were taken to Jerusalem, Davie county, where the funeral services were conducted and the interment was made Thursday, Rev. Swain officiating.

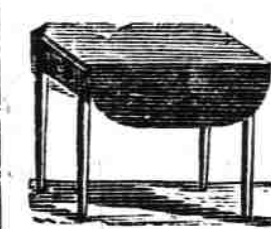
