Senator Overman Speaks on the Rate Bill. A Good Impression.

Senator Overman addressed the Senate today in favor of railway rate legislation, discussing both the facts and the law. He spoke for more than an hour and held the attention of both the Senate floor and the galleries. All the members of the North Carolina delegation in the House were present to hear the initial speech of the junior Senator.

Though he has participated in numerous colloquies and participated and discussed hurriedly the Panama canal treaty, this was Senator Overman's first set argument. When he concluded he was heartily congratulated by his colleagues, among whom were leaders on both sides, who spoke especially of the force and originality of the arguments presented by him.

The feature of Senator Overman's appearance in debate was the fact that he maintained himseif so well when subjected to cross-fire by his colleagues. He was interrupted by Senators Tillman, Bacon and Fulton and was equal to every emergency, maintaining his equipoise and serenity in a striking way while replying to the questions directed to him.-Washington Dispatch.
