

Amendment Unconstitutional.

State Secretary S. F. Vance has received a report from the law committee of the National Council, Junior Order United American Mechanics, on the amendments to the State constitution as passed at the last meeting of the North Carolina council in Salisbury last February. In its report the National committee approved article 2, section 2, making juniors past State councillor and State treasurer members of the executive board, but disapproves and declares the amendment to article 5, section 2, increasing the per capita tax for the purpose of building and maintaining an orphans' home in the State illegal and unconstitutional. It appears that the building and maintaining of an orphans' home is unconstitutional from the fact that it is not one of the objects of the order, and the members cannot be taxed to pay anything that is not in the object of the order.

The national council has for one of its objects the building and maintaining of a national orphans' home and can therefore tax the State councils for such purpose.—Winston dipatch.

Mrs. Jefferson Davis Ill.

Mrs. Jefferson Davis is dangerously ill from grip at her apartment in the Hotel Gerard in this city. Mrs. Davis is now nearly 80 years of age and it is feared the attack may prove serious on account of her age. Mrs. J. A. Hayes, Mrs. Davis' daughter, has been summoned by telegraph. Mrs. Davis caught a severe cold a week ago. Nothing was thought of this until warning symptoms testified to the attack of grip. Dr. Robert H. Wylie is attending Mrs. Davis. In addition to her servants, a trained nurse is in constant attendance upon the aged woman. It was said at the hotel that grave doubts were held as to Mrs. Davis' recovery. She is gradually growing weaker.—New York dispatch.

Way Down Rollins and Butler.

Representative Blackburn, of North Carolina, seems to have complete control of the party in his State, and the indications point to the political death of former Senator Butler and Chairman Rollins at the test of strength this year. Blackburn has just come through a trial for practicing before the department which declared him guiltless. The trial aroused a great deal of sympathy for him and when the verdict was handed down Blackburn found himself more popular than he had ever been in his State. While Blackburn promised to capture the Republican organization over Butler and Rollins, it will not be surprising if the North Carolinians repudiate the whole clique and send a Democrat to Washington to represent the mountain district, which only went Republican by 200 votes.—Washington Correspondence Louisville Courier-Journal.

Frost Kills Cotton.

Reports from all parts of Mecklenburg county yesterday indicated that a good part of the cotton that had come up was killed by the frost and cold Wednesday night. Mr. T. J. Davis, manager of the E'lba Manufacturing Company, and other cotton oil manufacturers and ginners yesterday received scores of applications from farmers for cotton seed for replanting. One man who owns a large plantation stated that he would have to plant 200 acres of cotton over again. Quite a number of farmers even yesterday began plowing up the injured crop to re-plant. From the reports it seems that all the cotton that had been worked was killed, that which had just come up had not been disturbed, standing the cold and frost better. Also it was said that the cotton on the sandy soil stood the weather better than on the clay and "black jack" land.—Charlotte Observer.

Cotton Killed in Iredell.

The indications here are that the unusual cool spell this week has resulted in much damage to crops, especially cotton and vegetables. There was frost Tuesday and Wednesday mornings, but yesterday morning there was a killing frost and from all over the county where cotton is grown came reports that all cotton up had been killed by the frost. In addition to the damage to cotton the frost yesterday also hurt early vegetables and it is probably also that the cool spell will affect the fruit that was not far enough advanced to withstand it. The lowest thermometer registered was 36, but farmers coming in from north Iredell report some ice. The farmers in this section are all short on cotton seed and the Statesville Cotton Oil Mill has closed down and will sell its seed to the farmers in order that they may replant.—Statesville dispatch.
