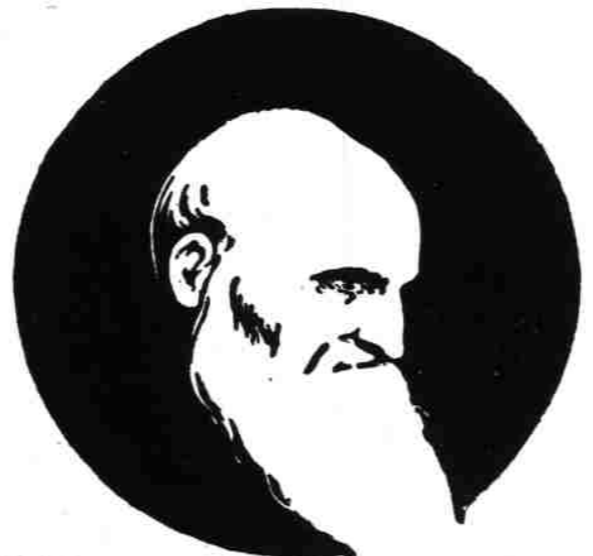
Teachers' Meeting Adjourned.
