Plan Might Work Farther South.

Washington, May 5 .- The interstate commerce commission has rendered its first opinion in a case involving the reasonableness of an express rate. The case was brought by the Society of American Florists, who claimed that the rate charged by the United States Express Company on cut flowers from New Jersey points to New York city was urreasonable, excessive and unjust. In July 1906. the rate was increased from 50 cents to \$1.00 per handred pounds The commission rules that the rate should be reduced to 60 cents per hundred pound's and holds that the express company cannot justify its increase in rate by the mere production of its contracts with its own agents and the rail-

Former Dean Huffcut Suicides.

New York, May 4.—Ernest Huffcut, former dean of Cornel University law school, one of the leading authorities on constitutional law in the United States and personal counsel of Governor Hughes, ended his life today by shooting. The upper deck of the Hudson river steamer C. W. Morse was chosen by Mr. Huffcut as the scene of the commission of his tragic act. Some time early this morning while the steamer was coming down the river from Al bany to this city and while the steamer was swept by the heavy rain storm which prevailed for hours, the lawyer seated himself ATTORNEYS & COUNSELORS AT LAW in a deck chair and sent a bullet into his braiu. His body was found hours later by a deck hand when the steamer had almost reached her dock. His identity was not known at that time and it was not until Governor Hughes. who chanced to be in the city, had visited the undertaking rooms where his body lay that the identification was made positive.
