**SALISBURY AND ROWAN DRY.**

Old North State Gives an Overwhelming Majority for Prohibition.

The election passed off quietly in this county yesterday. Both sides worked strenuously but there was no trouble of any kind. The following is a list of the returns from the various precincts of the county so far as can be learned today.

With returns from 86 counties of the 98 counties the result shows 70 counties gave majorities for prohibition while 16 gave majorities against. The net majority for prohibition from these counties is 48,000. Cabarrus, Iredell, Davie and Davidson went dry by good majorities while Stanly gave a wet majority of 166.

The election went off in an orderly manner here, although interest was at fever heat. Several parties, however, who were under the influence of whiskey were not as orderly as they might have been. This morning C. M. Bailey, proprietor of a saloon, attacked the Freeman brothers, managers of the Pepsi-Cola plant. He drew his pistol and fired, but did not harm. Mr. Freeman then struck Mr. Bailey. Sheriff Kridler arrested Bailey and a preliminary trial was held before Judge Joe Kesler. All parties concerned were put under bond and another hearing will be had later.
