Drastic Temperance Bill Passes Georgia House.

Atlanta, July 10.—The Alexander substitute for the the Tipples liquor bill, containing provisions tightening those of the original measure, passed the House today after several days of fighting...

The House also voted down an amendment providing the reference of the measure to a vote of the people.

The Alexander-Tipples bill is especially drastic toward locker clubs and provides ways by which the Governor practically controls them and carries provisions for prosecution for perjury if the officials of such clubs swear to falsehoods in testifying.

The bill is yet to go to the Senate.
