A Spreading Disease that May Kill Cattle How to Treat it.

We are beginning to receive re ports of some diseases that spread over the entire State last fall, Mycotic Stomatitis, or the sore mouth and feet of cattle. This is a disease caused by cattle eating feed containing irritating fungi which causes an inflammatory condition of the mouth, tongue,

The disease is the result of cattle eating feed containing irritating fungi, the fungi is usually found on the grasses during an unusually hot, wet season, immediately after heat and moisture being conducive to its growth.
