Annie Ferrel, Negro, and her two children, aged 15 and 18 years, were struck and killed Monday by lightning near Washington, N. C., says a report from that place.

Henry Little, well-known farmer and one of Catawba County's best citizens, died at Claremont Sunday afternoon, as a result of injuries received three weeks ago last Sunday night, when his team ran away in Claremont and hurled both himself and wife and a small child to the ground with such force that the couple were rendered unconscious for many hours. Mr Little was about 60 years old and is survived by his wife and 12 children.
