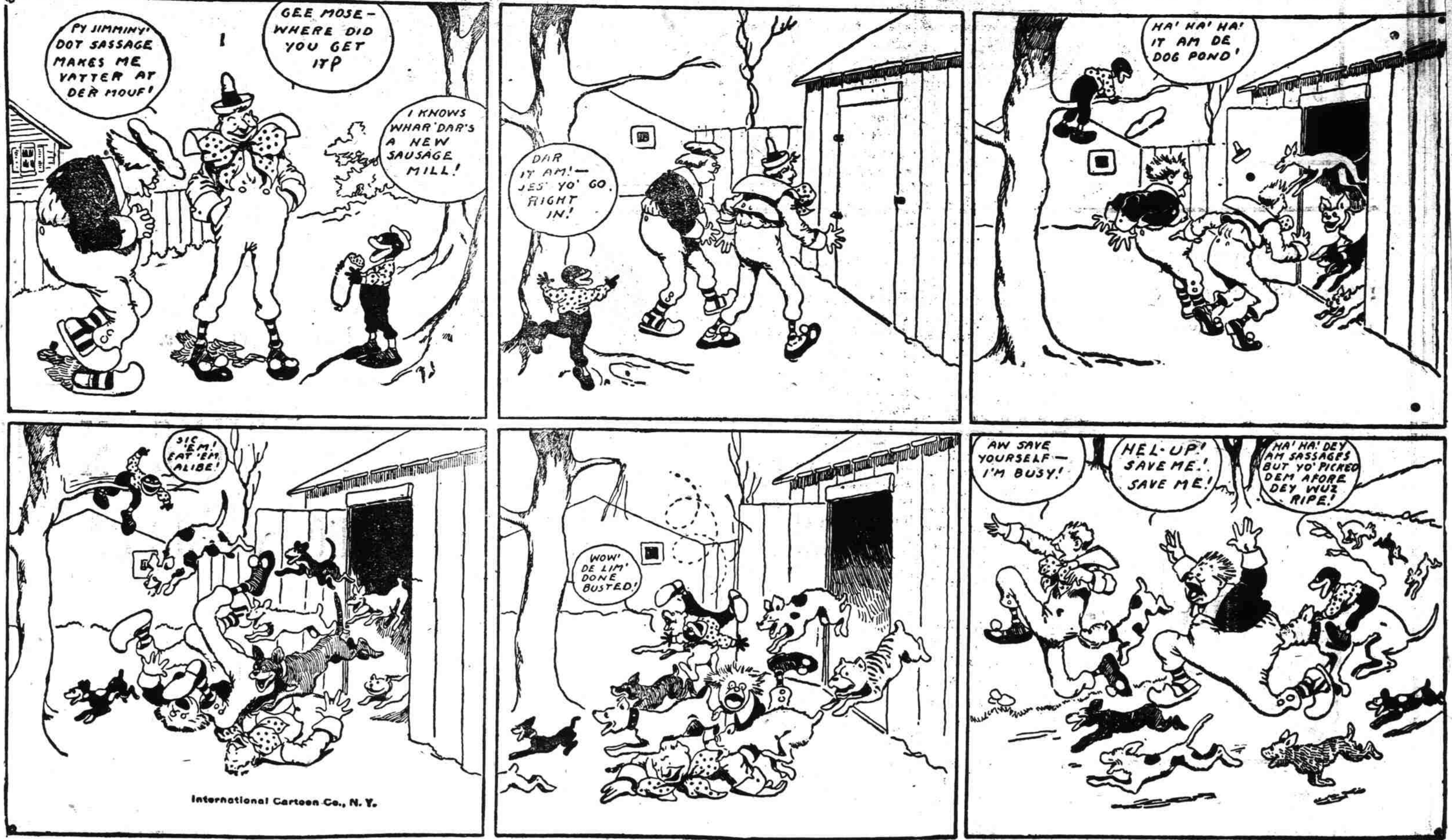


**SOME OF ROWEN'S OLD FOLKS.**
