Who is in Command?

The recent mobilization of the militia has brought out some rather peculiar things in regard to the appointment and promotion of officers.

One of these appears in a press dispatch sent out from Washington under date of June 29. It says: "Recommendations for promotion of officers of the National Guard have been filed at the War Department. The list was prepared by Major General O'Ryan and forwarded to Senator O'Gorman, who approved it and added his own recommendation and filed with the secretary of war."

It would seem from this that the O'Ryan and O'Gormans have a lot to do with the military affairs of this country; and it is not unlikely since O'Gorman is the papist senator from the state of New York.

But the appointment of one Priest Vigliero to be a chaplain in the Louisiana militia, not by election or by officials of Louisiana, but by the Roman Catholic Archbishop J. H. Blenk, is even more noticeable.

From an account of the appointment in the New Orleans Daily States of July 1, and a letter from the archbishop printed therewith and addressed to headquarters at the State camp near Alexandria we quote the following: "I must now write you again to let you know at once that I have named a priest who I think is well known to you. His name is the Rev. John Vigliero, at present rector at Patterson La. He is to leave Patterson tomorrow morning at about 9 o'clock and will report to you at once for duty upon his arrival. You will kindly consider this letter as his proper credentials from me."

From this it seems that militia chaplains in Louisiana, one at least, get their credentials and right to commissions in the National Guard from the New Orleans agent of the Italian pope. A rather remarkable state of affairs, is it not?

RAILROAD WAGES

Shall they be determined by Industrial Warfare or Federal Inquiry?

To the American Public:

Do you believe in arbitration or industrial warfare? The train employes on all the railroads are voting whether they will give their leaders authority to tie up the commerce of the country to enforce their demands for a 100 million dollar wage increase. The railroads are in the public service—your service. This army of employes is in the public service—your service. You pay for rail transportation 3 billion dollars a year, and 44 cents out of every dollar from you goes to the employes.

On all the Southern railroads in 1915, seventy-five per cent of the train employes earned these wages (lowest, highest and average of all) as shown by the payrolls—

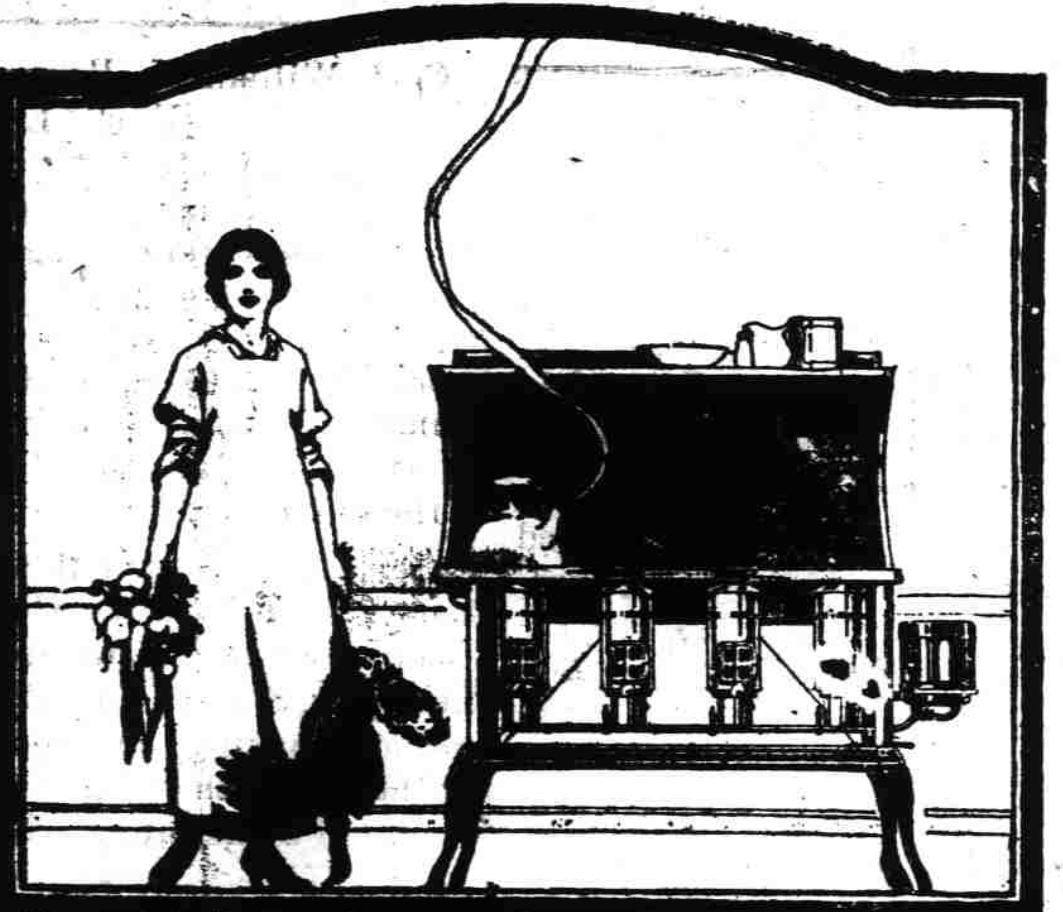
A 100 million dollar wage increase for men in freight and yard service (less than one-fifth of all employes) is equal to a 5 per cent advance in all freight rates.

The managers of the railroads, as trustees for the public, have no right to place this burden on the cost of transportation to you without a clear mandate from a public tribunal speaking for you.

The railroads have proposed the settlement of this controversy either under the existing national arbitration law, or by reference to the Interstate Commerce Commission. This offer has been refused by the employes' representatives.

Shall a nation-wide strike or an investigation under the Government determine this issue?
