Hunting Men for the Army.
 Lieut. D. E. Murph, the recruiting officer located here, accompanied by an enlisted man, will go to Kannapolis and China Grove today and to Mocksville and Cooleemee tomorrow seeking recruits for the army. He will make a similar trip to these places on the 11th and 12th and 25th and 26th of October. He gets his authority for these trips by special orders, No. 220, of the War Department.

First Regiment on Three Specials.
 On Board Special Train Somewhere Between New Bern and Wilmington, Sept. 25.—The First Regiment is off on the long trip to the border traveling on three special trains. The first section bears brigade headquarters, with the clerical force, Brigadier General Young, Major Gordon Smith brigade adjutant, Lieut. W. B. Stone, of Thomasville, and Lieut. Robert E. Young, of Swannanoa, aides; Col. J. T. Gardner and staff and the First Battalion.

Latest reports have it that the First North Carolina Brigade is to become part of the Seventh Division, taking the place of a brigade of Pennsylvania troops now being sent home. The remainder of the division is composed of Pennsylvania troops, than whom there are no more efficient in the Nation. It was intended originally to place North Carolina in the Ninth Division, along with South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. This division has not been organized. Just what will be the fate of Major S. Glenn Brown, ordnance officer detailed for service on the staff of the Ninth, and of Major Baxter R. Hunter, of the Medical Corps, also detailed for service in this division, is not known.
