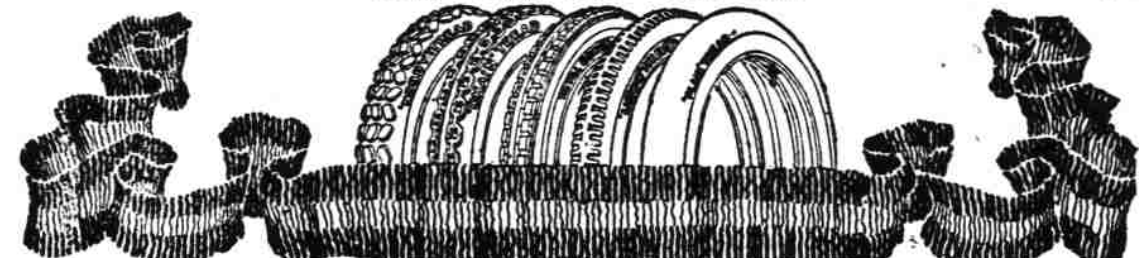

**SALISBURY

Efforts are being made to arrest automobilists who insist upon exceeding the speed limit, running at night without lights, violating the traffic laws and making useless noises. Several have been apprehended and paid costs.

The threshing machine men of Rowan county, almost to a man met in the old court house here Monday and after considering the matter before them passed a resolution agreeing to thresh wheat at this year at the rate of four bushels out of each one hundred will do all possible to prevent the waste of wheat and cooperate with the government in every way possible.

105 French soldiers known as "blue devils" passed through Salisbury Tuesday morning enroute to Charlotte, Atlanta and other points South. They are in charge of Corporal Ormerod of the United States Expeditionary forces in France and are here in the interest of the war. Most of them wore decorations for bravery.

The dwelling of John Smith, colored, was badly damaged by fire the other day. The building caught from a bad flue.

Last Sunday when Rev. Floyd Fry, pastor of Calvary Baptist church near Ellis cross roads, Franklin Township, had finished his morning sermon and went to get his buggy, he was somewhat surprised to find it missing, but finally recognized his horse hitched to a new buggy, a surprise gift by the congregation. When he realized the situation he heartily thanked those present for the interest they took in his welfare.

The Drum Medicine Company of Charlotte has located in Salisbury and opened its offices and laboratory in the Mint Cola bottling plant's building across the railroad from the passenger station. E. M. Drum is president and general manager of the company.

Spencer and East Spencer have lined up against an increase in telephone rates by the Bell telephone corporation.

E. S. Millsaps, district agent and farm demonstrator, was in Rowan last week, looked over the condition of the wheat crop and reports that it is damaged probably 40 per cent. This damage he says was done by the Hessian fly during the recent warm weather. We have seen some wheat fields and inquired after others. Mr. Millsaps estimate of damage done seems too high.

A list of 141 young men of this county have been called to appear at the Federal building next Wednesday morning, May 29th, to entrain for Camp Jackson, Columbia, S. C. They will leave on the afternoon train at 2:40 o'clock.

Miss Mary Morris and Fred Leazer of Salisbury were united in marriage, Sunday, May 12th.

The State Camp of the Patriotic Sons of America is holding its annual meeting at Goldsboro this week. Rev. W. B. Dutera is president and W. A. Daniel is secretary, both of Salisbury. This order is now conducting its own funeral benefit department and is meeting with splendid success.

Mesdames C. E. Gregory, W. S. Blackweider and J. D. Norwood were in China Grove Sunday afternoon accompanied by Rev. George Harrison in the interest of the Red Cross campaign for funds. After several short addresses a committee was formed to do the work. Mrs. A. M. Hanna was selected Captain, and she selected five assistants, to wit: Mesdames W. J. Swink, B. S. Shuford, W. C. Siffard, P. A. Earnhardt and Miss Mary Ramsaur.

Revenue Officer F. C. Talbort, participated in a raid in Yadkin county last week. A steam still was found and destroyed. It had just been set up and no spirits were discovered and no arrests were made.

Capt. H. C. Trott, proprietor of the Sanitary Market, has closed his place of business and has asked to be adjudged a bankrupt. His assets are given as \$20,800 and his liabilities at \$22,041.80.

The Salisbury public schools close Friday at eleven o'clock Sunday morning. Rev. John W. Moore of Charlotte will preach the commencement sermon in the Ellis street school auditorium Monday afternoon the senior class will hold their exercise and Monday night Prof. H. I. Williams of the University will deliver an address to the graduating class. This will be followed by class essay and the awarding of diplomas.
