YULE TREE FIRE CAUTION URGED

Use of every possible precaution against fires in connection with Christmas trees and other decorations of the holiday season is being urged by the fire department.

It was pointed out that many fires and serious accidents occur during the Yule season each year because of the use of large quantities of highly inflammable decoration material.

The following rules were advocated: "Avoid lighted candles in the decoration of the tree. Use carefully wired electric lights.

"Place the tree a safe distance from stove or fireplace.

"Use metal tinsel for trimming, and mica or flake asbestos for imitation snow.

"Cotton trimming and cotton-whiskered Santa Clauses are very dangerous. Santa suits and whiskers can be made fire resistant. Consult your insurance man about this.

"Never have lighted Christmas trees unguarded.

"Do not place the tree where it will obstruct any room exit.

"Keep candles and open lights away from window curtains, paper wreaths

"Remove the tree from the house before it becomes dry."
