

# Gov't Payroll Reaches \$35,640,000 A Year

## OVER 1 MILLION PERSONS ON THE FEDERAL PAYROLL

### Budget Bureau, Complying With Numerous Requests From Congress And Officials, Compiles Information.

The Government has 1,023,373 employees, and it pays them \$1,315,690,467 yearly.

This was shown in the first compilation of such data by the Budget Bureau after many requests from Congress and officials for the information.

Until now the bureau had even been unable to give the figures to President Hoover.

The compilation included the army, navy, marine corps, coast guard and officers in the public health service and geodetic survey. It showed there were 732,460 civilian employees, who receive \$1,055,970,636 annually, while there are 290,913 persons in the military services, which cost \$259,719,830.

Salary costs for civilian employees included the value of quarters, subsistence and other facilities or services supplied by the Government.

The salary of the military personnel was the net salary of both active and retired men, but did not include such allowances as distinguished from pay.

The compilation showed the total civil and military employees who receive less than \$1,000 a year were 345,351, with a total salary of \$154,846,967.

The next highest salary group re-

ceives \$2,100 and numbers 118,759, with total salaries of \$247,086,923, while there are 1,602 persons receiving \$5,000 annually, but less than \$5,200, with total salaries of \$8,039,054.

There are only 134 persons in the group receiving \$10,000 and 32 receiving \$15,000 and up.

In the Government service 1,015,928 receive less than \$5,000, with total salaries of \$1,271,026,885, and 982,777 receive less than \$3,100, with total salaries of \$1,146,574,229.

In the civilian group there are 24,186 who receive less than \$2,100, with total salaries of \$435,413,349.

Employees numbering 699,489 receive less than \$3,000, with total salaries of \$925,748,178, and 727,724 receive less than \$5,000, with total salaries of \$1,026,878,734.

In the military group 220,673 persons receive less than \$1,000 annually, while 264,803 receive less than \$2,000 a year.
