# More Cheese Factories Needed In State

#### **HUGE QUANTITY** IS CONSUMED IN **NORTH CAROLINA**

N. C. People Eat 12 Million Pounds A Year; Most Of It Imported From Wisconsin.

According to the best information available, North Carolina merchants purchase annually about 12,000,000 pounds of cheese. This huge quantity is necessary because the per capita consumption of cheese is especially large in this state due to the popularity of the product with textile op-

eratives and all classes of workers who have long ago discovered that cheese is "rib-sticking" and also will satisfy hunger with little expense compared with other foods.

At present average prices, North Carolina's cheese bill amounts to around \$2,000,000 per year and 95 per cent of this money eventually finds its way back to the Wisconsin farmer's pocketbook due to the fact that this state produces 80 per cent or more of all cheese made in the United States. This one item, in a large measure, explains the reason for finding so many large barns and fine rural nomes in Wisconsin.

The Dairy Field Extension forces at State College have long realized the advantages of overcoming the necessity of importing cheese from far away Wisconsin and have been persistently working for the development of this industry in North Carolina.

It has been a difficult problem to convince North Carolina merchants that just as good quality cheese can be made in North Carolina as in Wisconsin. However, this has been successfully accomplished and last year nearly one-half million pounds were roduced in this state.

Recently, due to the advantage in transportation cost over cheese shipped to North Carolina from long distances, the demand has been so great for North Carolina made cheese that the Kraft Phenix and Scott Cheese factories located in western North Carolina have not been able to supply one-tenth of the demands.

The territory best adapted for cheese manufacturing in this state, includes the foothills and mountain counties.

Now that this industry has been proven to be sound, it is predicted that in a few years North Carolina farmers will receive the \$2,000,000 that annually has been leaving the state for this nutritious dairy product.
