

Fifth Week Poll Gives Roosevelt Margin

Hoover Lags Behind As Vote Grows

Interesting Study Of Electoral College Votes Made Based On Straw Ballots

Twenty-Eight Roosevelt States Would Net Him Total of 288 Electoral Votes

The fifth revised tabulation of the near-wide Presidential poll of the Hearst morning, evening and Sunday newspapers indicates that Governor Roosevelt is still far in the lead. A trifle over 59 per cent of the straw votes returned go to the democratic nominee, while President Hoover's ballots amount to a fraction over 40 per cent.

It is interesting to note that more men have voted in the poll for Governor Roosevelt than the combined vote of both men and women voting for Mr. Hoover. This will be seen from the following summary:

The above tabulation indicates that the Hearst straw votes are blowing Governor Roosevelt's way in 37

states, while they favor President Hoover in 11 states. However, in a number of states the results are close. The Hoover majorities in Colorado, Kansas, New Jersey, New York and Ohio are extremely close. Out of 19,501 votes tabulated from the state of New York, Mr. Hoover has a bare majority of only 17 ballots. On the other hand, the Roosevelt majorities in Delaware, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Montana, New Mexico, Oregon, Pennsylvania and Wyoming are correspondingly close. Mr. Hoover has "safe" majorities in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont, while the remaining 28 states appear to be giving Governor Roosevelt very substantial majorities.

A tabulation of the various groupings above give the following interesting results:

The 28 Roosevelt states have a combined electoral vote of 288.

The 9 Roosevelt states, where the vote is close enough to place them in the "doubtful" column, have 98 votes in the electoral college.

The six "safe" Hoover states, all of which are in New England, have 41 votes.

The 5 Hoover states, where the vote is extremely close, have 104 votes.

Should Mr. Hoover carry all of New England, including Maine which went Democratic last Monday, and all of the doubtful states he would receive 243 electoral votes. This would fall short of assuring his election by 23 votes, 266 being necessary. Should Governor Roosevelt carry the 28 states, where he has a clear-cut straw vote majority in the above mentioned poll, he will have 23 votes more than are needed to win the election. Moreover, if he carries all of these and any part of these states classified as "doubtful" he may have such a landslide as swept Hoover in the White House four years ago.
