



Friendly Even After Divorce

Many in Movie Colony Adopt This Latest Fashion---Year Promises to Be Record---34 Parted So Far

Hollywood.—The year 1932 promises to set a record in broken romances for motion picture folk, but a lot of the marriage dissolutions have been accomplished in the friendliest fashion.

Thirty-four marriages of film notables have ended this year. There were 37 in all of 1931.

Set The Fashion

Midway in the wholesale disruption of alliances, Ann Harding and Harry Bannister presented a model case to inaugurate the friendly divorce fashion. They weren't going to continue as husband and wife, they said in letters on embossed and heavy stationery to the press, because to do so would imperil their love for each other. The sacrifice was further justified because Bannister, as a single man, could better pursue his motion picture career.

The latest case was that of Greta Nissen and Weldon Heyburn, who parted the "very best of friends and with much regret."

The friendship of Maurice Chevalier and Yvonne Vallee contin-

ued with such warmth after their separation that she prepared their home for his arrival in France from Hollywood.

To Be Better Friends

Nils Asther and Vivian Duncan separated with expressions of esteem, and Dorothy Hall of New York, who appears in pictures when not on the stage, separated from Neal Andrews, cosmetic manufacturer, with the statement they intended to live apart "to become better friends."

Miriam Hopkins remains a close friend of Austin Parker, writer, and Ralph Forbes felicitated Ruth Chatterton, his former wife, on her marriage to George Brent. All three are friendly.
