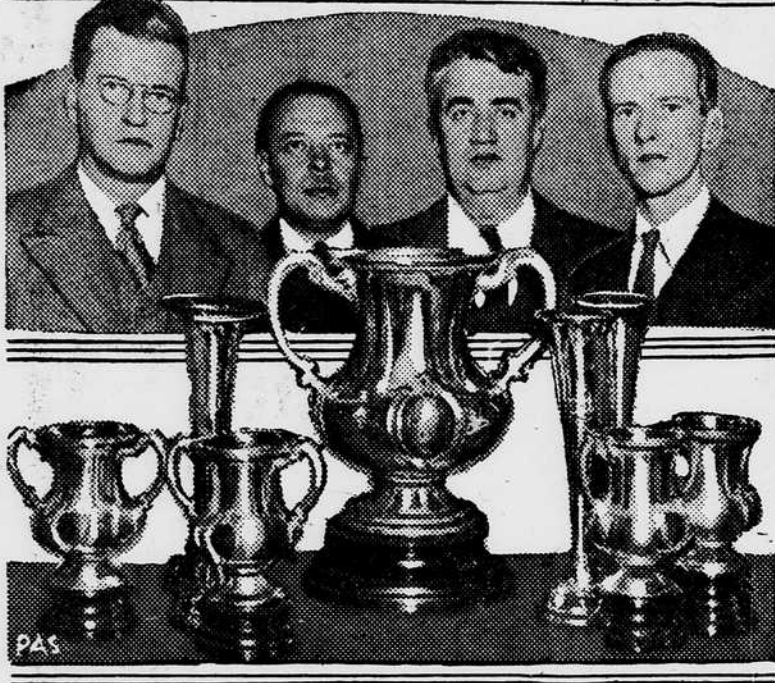


Establish Contract Bridge Supremacy
