**Arey Gives List Of 1932 Dairy Accomplishments**

Ten definite accomplishments by dairymen of North Carolina for the year 1932 are recorded by John A. Arey, dairy extension specialist.

- He lists them as follows:
1. There was an increase of 26 per cent in the production of creamery butter over the year 1931.
  2. There was an increase by 20 per cent in the production of cheese over the previous year.
  3. There was an increase of 14 pounds of butterfat per cow, considering the cows in the herd improvement associations.

4. Dairy farmers began the use of the economical trench, silo, digging forty-one during the latter part of the year.

5. Seventy old barns were remodelled.

6. Seventy-five cooling tanks for milk and cream were constructed.

7. At the request of dairymen, there were mailed blue-print plans for 286 barns, 95 milk houses, and 30 safety bull-pens.

8. There were 238 pure-bred dairy bulls placed.

9. One new creamery was established.

10. One new cheese factory was established.

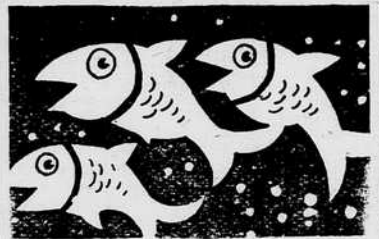
**ORDER OF NOTICE THEREON**

While we are having reconstruction all over the world we should cancel all of these papers and refinance the town over a period of some 50 years so it would not keep all manufacturing industries out of it on account of being taxed to death. It would not keep a man, who owns his home, working night and day to try to pay off something he had nothing to do with putting on him but was done by a lot of selfish politicians, most of whom owned no property in the city. When they got their rake-off they did not care how the taxpayers would get along with the load.

(3) I am in favor of all City Councilmen and Mayor working without any salary during this depressed time. Men who cannot spare enough time and serve their city free of charge should not be elected as every penny spent unnecessarily is working a hardship on the taxpayers.

(4) I am in favor of running the town on an economical basis the same as other industries. The taxpayers money should be as sacred as our own money, but of course politicians have become like a good many of our big bankers and as long as the public will stand for them to spend the money for anything they wish they will continue to do so.

I pledge myself, if you give your support and I am elected, to do all in my power to carry out the above. Our city should be the largest city in North Carolina, but on account of cheap politicians and high tax rates all industries have gone to other towns and we people who have our investments in our town cannot get away and we have to be dictated to by people, most of whom do not own any property at all.

The Tax Law provides that all real estate, new improvements, and personal property must be listed as of April 1st, and imposes a penalty of 10 per cent for "FAILURE TO LIST" during the month of April.

All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 years must file a return on poll tax.
