Where And How Loans Are Made Under The New Federal **Emergency Farm Mortgage Act**

In the first two days after the passage of the Féderal Emergency Farm Mortgage Act, applications for relief were received from 1,-269 farmers. Most of these applications were sent to Washington, indicating that few farmers know where the Federal Land Banks for their districts are located.

There are twelve of these banks, and in connection with each of them a Loan Commissioner to operate under the new law has been appointed. These new loans are made to refinance farm indebtedness, provide working capital for farm operations and to aid in the redemption of foreclosed farms. They are not, primarily, made for the purpose of refinancing farm mortgages. That is to be done through the Federal Land Banks working in connection with the present holders of first mortgages.

There Are Loans Limits Loans under the new law are limited to \$5,000 to any one farmer. The amount that may be loaned, added to existing mortgages or other debts secured by the farm property cannot be more than sufficient to bring the total debt up Tennessee. 
