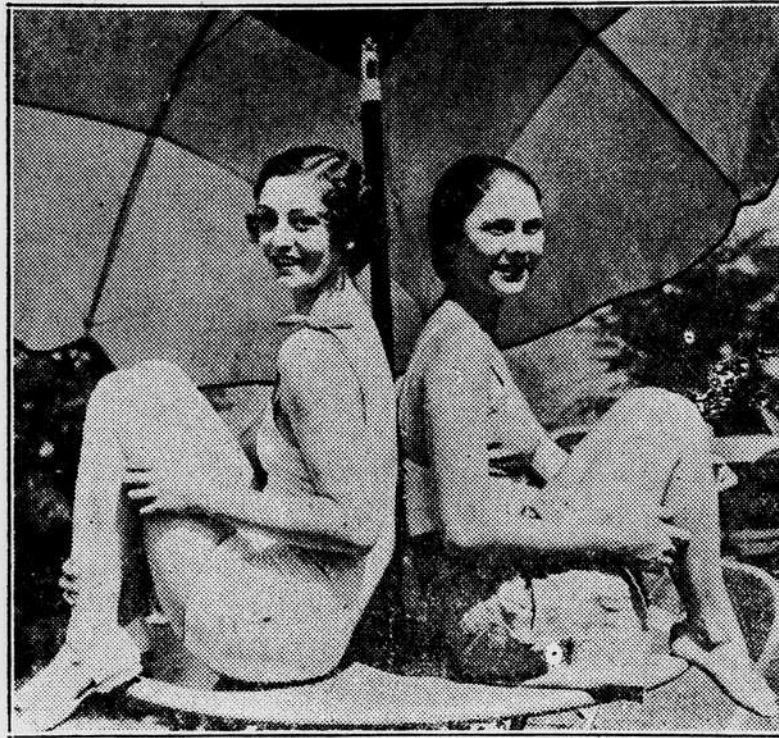
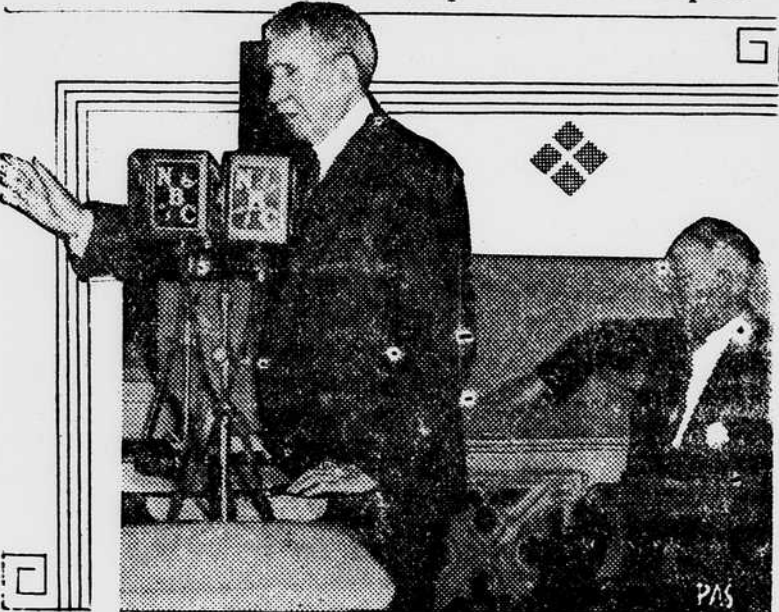


### Snake Swim Suits Fair Fad

## Urges Divorce by Mutual Consent be Made Legal

Divorce by mutual consent has been practiced in the United States since at least 1887, despite laws to contrary, and should be legalized because most people are in favor of it, the American Association for Advancement of Science was told in Chicago.

About seven-eighths of the divorces obtained in the United States since 1887 have been uncontested cases, "indicating, undoubtedly in a majority of these cases, that they were obtained through the mutual consent of the parties involved," said Charles R. Metzger, of the University of Indiana. "The feeling prevails," he went on, "that the time has come when divorce by mutual consent should be considered dispassionately with the idea of modifying laws to conform with the customs of the people." He spoke before a symposium on "The Family," sponsored by the American Sociological Society and the Society for Social Research.

### FRANCE TO TAX U. S. IMPORTS

Paris.—A compensatory exchange surtax of 15 per cent on American imports is likely to be imposed in the next few days if the United States dollar continues its drop in relation to the franc. It is understood that France already has advised the state department in Washington, through the ambassador, that imposition of the tax is imminent.

### PREFERS HIS PRISON

Kansas City, Kas.—In his cell in the Wyandotte county jail, a man who said he was Luke Parsons told of spending 26 of his 61 years in prison. He was arrested after saying he burned a barn in the hope of being sent to the Kansas penitentiary. "It's the best job when a man is 61, as I am, and has no friends," he said.
