

### MORGENTHAU TAKES REINS OF TREASURY

Washington — Henry Morgenthau, Jr., of New York City, has assumed control of the federal government's finances following induction into office at the White House as Secretary of the Treasury.

Morgenthau's appointment was announced by the President immediately following the resignation of William H. Woodin, also of New York, who has been ill in Arizona.

"No change will be made in Treasury policy," Morgenthau said.

It was indicated that Earl Baillie, special assistant to the Secretary, would not be named as Undersecretary.

Baillie came to Washington with the intention of remaining only a few months, Morgenthau said.

His appointment had been criticized by Senator Couzens (Republican), of Michigan, because of a connection with a New York stock and bond firm.

Immediately upon the appointment of Morgenthau, Dean Acheson, Acting Secretary of the Treasury and Undersecretary, was dropped. It was stated that he was well out of sympathy with the President's monetary program.

Thomas Hewes, Assistant Secretary, also resigned, but because of personal differences with Morgenthau.

### Many To Fly To Calf Born To Miami Air Races

A record number of sportsman pilots will fly to the All American Air Races to be held January 11 to 13 at Miami, according to Major E. E. Aldrin, head of the aviation division of the Standard Oil company of New Jersey and a member of the contest committee at the races. He took off from Newark Friday for Miami.

"The races," said Major Aldrin, "will be well attended, a fact which is encouraging to us in aviation, as it indicates that sportsmen pilots who a year ago felt they could not leave their offices because of conditions today feel free to get away for the event."

Major Aldrin also praised Helen Richey and Frances Marsalis, new holders of the women's refueling endurance record, established at Miami.

"When a feat of this kind is successful American engine builders may well feel proud," he pointed out. "Such a flight speaks volumes for the efficiency of modern aviation engines and fuels which American scientists have developed in the past ten years."

The rocker arms of the motor of the Outdoor Girl were greased from within the plane's cabin, instead of from precarious position on a narrow catwalk as in many previous endurance flights, according to officials of the Standard Oil Company of New Jersey, which provided a special rocker arm lubricant which the endurance flyers used instead of grease. These officials also said that as the plane entered upon its tenth day in the air it had already consumed approximately 2,800 gallons of gasoline and 70 gallons of oil. With the exception of a small initial supply, this fuel and lubricant was supplied them in their refueling contacts in the mid-air.

### Cow On Byrd Expedition

#### Klondike Nira Presents Handsome Son To Expedition.

Overshadowing all previous events of the second Byrd Antarctic Expedition, Klondike Nira, the pedigreed Guernsey cow loaned the expedition by Klondike Farm, has presented a handsome bull calf to the Byrd flagship. It was born within sight of the greatest iceberg display ever seen by any of the veteran polar explorers on board, and barely a day's steaming from the edge of the unknown waters encircling the Pacific quadrant of Antarctica.

Announcing the event, the following radiogram was sent from the S. S. Jacob Rupert to Thurmond Chatham:

"Bull calf born to Klondike 4:30 p. m., eastern standard time, December 19. Weight 75 pounds. Right fore foot and both hind feet white to knee. Left fore foot brown. White star on forehead. Blue eyes. Calf born on our first day in ice with ship surrounded by huge icebergs. Klondike and calf in fine condition. Regards and congratulations."

The following radiogram was sent the Jacob Rupert in reply: "Argilla Knight, father: For most's Gay Lad, grandfather, and a hundred close relatives send greetings to Klondike Nira's young son. Thurmond Chatham, value.

### Processing Tax On Hogs To Continue

Raleigh—The hog processing tax rate during January will be 1 cent a pound, as it was in December, and will not be raised to a cent and a half, as was expected, for January, according to a telegram received by Collector Charles H. Robertson, for the North Carolina district, from U. S. Commissioner of Revenue Helvering.

This tax applies to the man who slaughters and sells one or more hogs and the rate is \$1 per 100 pounds. The information is to offset the impression or possibility of the tentative order that this hog processing tax was to be increased 50 per cent for January. Mr. Robertson said that it is possible that the rate will be increased for February, although he has received no instructions as to that month.

Washington — President Roosevelt has issued a proclamation returning to state banking authorities full banking control over state banks non-members of the Federal Reserve system. The proclamation amended the Chief Executive's proclamations of March 6 and March 9, and his executive order of March 10, under which the President assumed authority over all banks as a result of the March 4 banking crisis.
