Need Longer Staple In Domestic Cotton

A decided decline in exports of cotton through the Wilmington and Norfolk ports has resulted in a decline in the need to grow short staple in North Carolina.

"When a large part of our cotton crop, particularly that grown in the Coastal Plain of eastern North Carolina, was exported through the Wilmington and Norfolk ports, a flat price was paid on local markets regardless of staple lengths. Prior to 1915, few improved varieties with a staple length of 15-16 to one and one-sixteenth of an inch were grown in the State," says P. H. Kime, associate agronomist at State College. "Then, too, the varieties producing 7-8 inch staple frequently outyielded those producing a longer staple. Later, since 1921 the Manchester mills in England have been demanding the He is being returned to Indiana longer or medium staples and consequently we have found ourselves loaded with more short cotton than our local mills have been able to consume. This cotton must be sold in competition with that grown in China and India."

As a result, Kime says, we need less cotton to be grown. What is grown,, however, hould have a staple length of 15-16 to 1 and 1well as the old 7-8 inch cotons.


