**MAY 5th**  
*Registration Books Open*  
 Date of opening of the Registration Books by the Registrars at the polling places at 9:00 a. m. for registration of new voters. Registration books are to remain open for registration until sunset on every Saturday through Saturday May 19th, for registration. C. S. 5947, and C. S. 6027, Secs 31 and 91 of Election Law pamphlet.

**MAY 19th**  
*Expiration Filing Time for Legislative, County, and Township Offices.*  
 Last day for candidates for selection as the nominees of any political party for the office of State Senator, member of the House of Representatives, and County and Township offices to file notice of Candidacy with the County Board of Elections. C. S. 6022, Sec. 87 of the Election Law pamphlet.

**MAY 22nd**  
*Certification of Names of Candidates for State Senate*  
 Last day for the Chairman of the County Boards of Elections in the Senatorial Districts composed of more than one county where there is no agreement as provided for in Section 6014 of the C. S. to certify to every other Chairman of the County Boards of Elections in such Senatorial District, the names of all candidates who have filed Notices of Candidacy in their respective county for the office of State Senator. C. S. 6028, Sec. 92 of Election Law pamphlet.

**MAY 22nd**  
*Statement of Expenditures to Be Filed*  
 Last day for Statements of Expenditures to be filed by candidates and campaign committees. All candidates for State and District offices shall file such statements with the Secretary of State. All candidates for State Senator in districts composed of only one county, members of the House of Representatives, and all county officers shall file such statements with the Clerk of the Superior Court of

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**MAY 26th**  
*Challenge Day*  
 Day for Registrars to attend the polling places with the registration books, from 9 a. m. until 3 p. m. when and where the registration books shall be opened to the public for inspection for the purpose of challenges. S. S. 5972, Sec. 44 of Election Law Pamphlet.

**JUNE 2nd**  
*Primary Election Held*  
 Date of Primary Election, C. S. 6018, Sec. 84 of Election Law pamphlet.

**JUNE 5th**  
*Meeting of County Election Boards To Tabulate Votes*  
 Day for the meeting of the County Boards of Elections at 11 o'clock a. m. at the Court House of the county to receive the returns of the Primary Election from the Registrars and Judge of Election of every precinct in the county, at which time the County Boards of Elections shall canvass the returns and declare the results of the Primary Election for all county and township officers and members of the House of Representatives. The County Boards of Elections shall also, at this meeting prepare duplicate abstracts of all the votes cast for candidates for all state and district offices and within one day thereafter send by registered mail one copy of this abstract to the chairman of the State Board of Elections, and file one copy, together with all precinct returns, with the Clerk of the Superior Court of the County. C. S. 5985-5989, Secs. 52-56 of Election Law pamphlet.

**JUNE 22nd**  
*Second Statements of Expenditures to Be Filed.*  
 Last day for candidates to file Statements of Expenditures with the Secretary of State and the Clerk of the Superior Court, same as shown for May 22nd above. P. L. 1931, Chap. 348, Sec. 6, 7, 8; Secs. 167-168 of Election Law pamphlet.

**JUNE 30th**  
*Second Primary Held If Necessary*  
 Date for Second Primary Election, where same is necessary. C. S. 6045, Sec. 109 of the Election Law pamphlet.

**JULY 3rd**  
*Meeting of County Election Boards To Tabulate Votes*  
 Second Primary  
 Day for the meeting of the County Boards of Election where a Second Primary is held, to canvass the returns, declare the results and to make out proper abstracts of the election, same as hereinbefore provided to be done after the first Primary Election on June 2nd.

## N. C. Teachers Are Reported As Lowest Paid

Raleigh—"No state in the nation is paying teachers as much as they are paid in North Carolina." This is one of the several rumors that is going the rounds in the State, others being that there are only three states paying more, and another that 41 states are paying less. N. C. teachers would be happy if either were true.

But neither of them is true, the truth being that teachers in this State are being paid among the lowest salaries in the nation, as has been ascertained by all figures that are available at this time, in a bulletin issued by the Public Relations Committee of the N. C. Education Association, of which Guy B. Phillips, Greensboro, was chairman until his recent election as president.

In North Carolina, the bulletin shows, on figures of the State School Commission, \$11,501,216 has been allotted to teachers, \$9,106,887 to white teachers and \$2,394,329 to negro teachers. The number of teachers allotted in the State is 23,077, or 16,528 white and 6,549 negro. By a simple process of division, it is found that the teachers receive an average of \$498 a year, \$550 for white and \$365 for negro teachers. Figured further, the bulletin points out the teachers get \$41.50 a month, or \$1.36 a day, on the 12 months basis.
