Of this \$10,030,655 refinanced farmers' debts to commercial banks, including receivers and conservators of banks; \$2,827,425 went on their debts to insurance companies; \$2,899,818 went on their taxes and \$32,063,517 went

on their debts to other creditors. Not all of the money has been oaned in actual cash. On March 26, the Federal Land Banks switched from closing loans with cash to closing them with bonds of the Federal Farm Mortgage Corporation. The Federal Land Bank of Columbia has already put out a total of approximately \$10,000,bankers and farmers' crediors have indicated that they are glad to accept them in lieu of cash.

The bonds now being used in all taxation except the usual inheritance, estate and gift taxes. Interest and principal of the bonds are guaranteed by the government.






