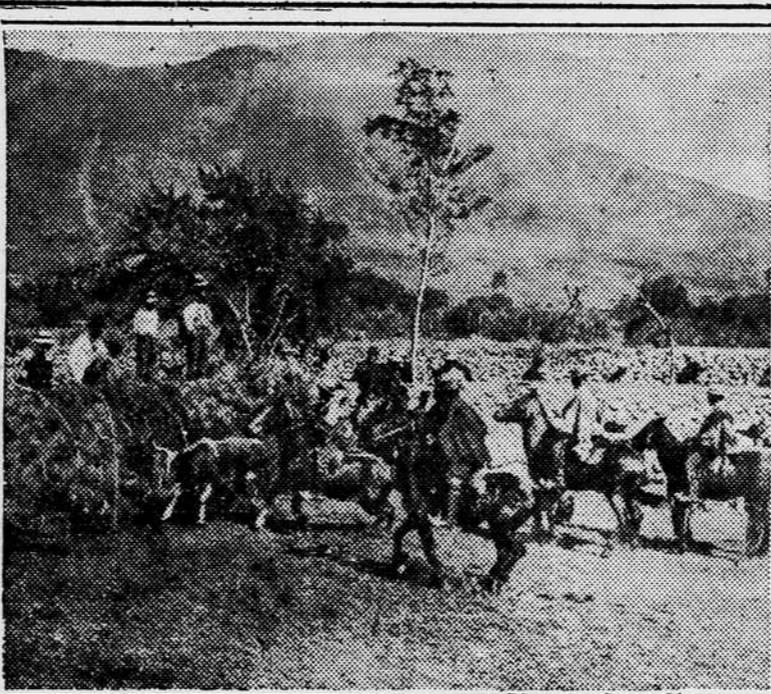

THIS is one of the old balcony-hung streets in Cartagena, Colombia, one of the few ports which President Roosevelt elected to visit, on his summer cruise. Despite the fact that the city lies on the path of the popular cruise route between New York, California and the Central Americas and is visited by hundreds of travelers every year, it has taken on but few of our modern ways.
