M., and continuing until completed, for non-payment of taxes real estate in the Town of Spencer, on which the taxes for the year 1933 have not been paid, the name of the owner of said real estate, the description thereof, and the amount of taxes due thereon for the year 1933, being set out below. To the amount stated as due, will be added all legal penalties, cost of advertising, cost of sale and all other legitimate charges.
