Suspension of Loans by HOLC Leaves Large Banquet Applause Here Number of Applications That Cannot Be Considered

Washington.—Announcement by the Home Owners' Loan corporation of the status of applications from distressed home owners for loans in North Carolina reveals that 5,695 homes probably face foreclosure by mortgagees in the state, with the sum involved estimated at \$14,541,845.

The statement is at the close of business November 16, and has a direct bearing on the recent resolution adopted by the board that no applications would be received. Coupled with this order was another that no applications would receive further consideration unless they had reached the legal division by November 15.

The statement shows that, since the HOLC began to operate, 20,-096 applications have been received in North Carolina at the main office at Salisbury, and at the Raleigh, Greenville, Asheville and Charlotte branches. Of this number 2,608 were withdrawn, as applicants were able to obtain fiancial assistance elsewhere.
