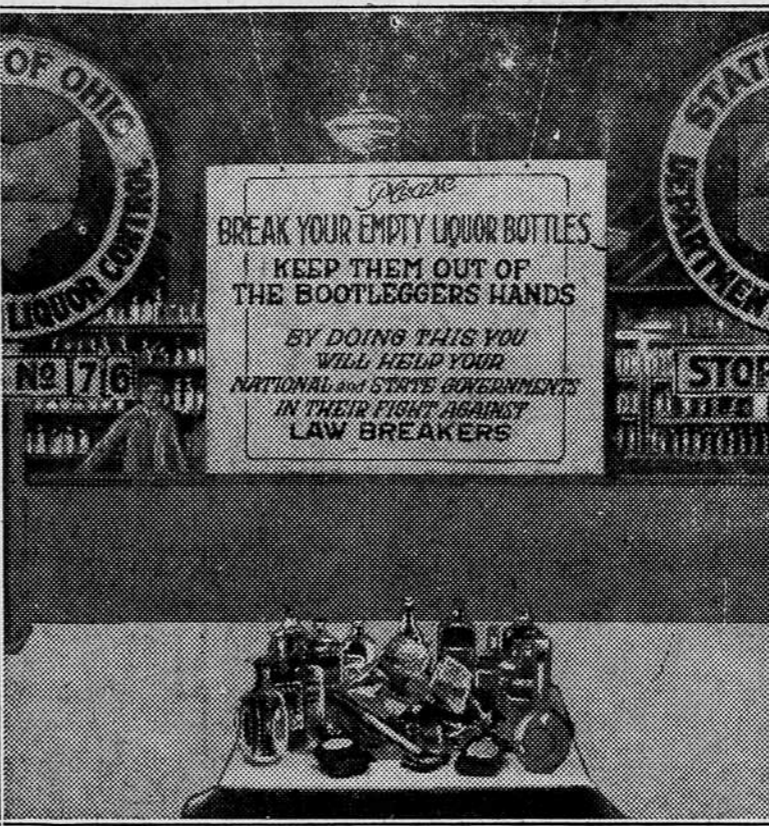

Debate Council Sets Dec. 9 As Date For Tryouts

Pi Kappa Delta Query Will Be Argued

Debates Being Scheduled With Out-of-State Teams

At a meeting of the debate council on Tuesday, Nov. 12, the date and rules to govern debating tryouts for the 1936 season were decided. The question for debate is the Pi Kappa Delta query: Resolved, that Congress should have power to override, by a two-thirds majority vote, decisions of the Supreme Court declaring acts passed by Congress unconstitutional.

Tryouts for both men's and women's varsity debating squads will be held on Monday evening, December 9, in the college auditorium before a committee of three faculty judges. Each person is to present a five minute speech which he has developed upon one point on either side of the question.

There is a fine opportunity this year for freshmen and others interested in debating to secure a place on the varsity squad. Two members of last year's team have been lost through graduation, while a third, Paul Strauch, has announced that he is too busy this year to compete. Harold Wolfinger, varsity debater for the past three seasons, is the only experienced member who will seek to hold a berth. Rachael Smith and Neely McCubbins, both of several years' experience, will form a nucleus for the girls' teams. And with the aid of Professor Lane, coach of debating, Catawba should have strong teams to uphold the record of the college.

Already Saint Francis College, of Penna., has scheduled a debate

here the first week in Feb., and Erskine will debate here on its tour through North Carolina.

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Four Catawba Students Nominated To College "Who's Who"

Names Will Appear In Second Edition Of Book Strayhorn, Smith, Cheek And Wolfinger Chosen

For a second time the University of Alabama is sponsoring a book, "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges." Because of the tremendous success of this publication last year, the university has decided to publish a bigger and greater "Who's Who" this year. It will include outstanding students in all the prominent colleges and universities in America.

H. Pettus Randall, editor of the book, recently wrote to the president of the student body, Wilson Cheek, asking for names of outstanding students. The president was advised that the proportion nominated should not exceed 1% of the student body. After discussion with the deans and faculty, the following were nominated for their outstanding qualities and their accomplishments: Carrie Bell Strayhorn, Rachael Smith, Harold Wolfinger, A. Wilson Cheek.

The purpose of "Who's Who" is to serve as an incentive to students, as a means of compensation to accomplished students, as a business and social recommendation, and as a standard of membership to honorary societies.

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
