AMENDMENT TO CERTIFICATE OF INCORPORATION TO DECREASE CAPITAL STOCK

RESOLUTION OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors of Carter and Trotter, Incorporated, a corporation of North Carolina, on the 18 day of December, 1935, adopted the following resolutions.

RESOLVED, that in the judgment of the Board of Directors of this company, it is advisable to change the certificate of incorporation so as to provide for a decrease of capital stock of the corporation from Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars to Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, to be accomplished by the surrender by every stockholder of his shares and the issue to him in place thereof of a decreased number of shares.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that a special meeting of the stockholders of this company be and the same is hereby called to be held at 11:00 o'clock A. M., on the 20 day of December, 1935, at the office of the company in the city of Salisbury, for the purpose of considering and taking action upon the proposed amendment to the certificate of incorporation and decrease of the capital stock of the company, and the secretary is directed to give notice of said meeting personally or by mail to each stockholder of this company.

Certificate of change decreasing capital stock by surrender of old stock and issue of new therefor.

Carter and Trotter, Incorporated, a corporation of North Carolina, hereby certifies that, pursuant to the foregoing resolutions of its board of directors, it has this day adopted the following resolutions:

RESOLVED that it is deemed advisable to decrease the capital stock of this corporation by rescinding paragraph IV of the certificate of incorporation and paragraph IV of the Amended Certificate of Incorporation which prescribe the amount and character of capital stock and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

"IV. The capital stock of Carter and Trotter, Incorporated, be and the same is hereby reduced from Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, the present outstanding capital stock, to Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars, divided into one hundred shares of the par value of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars each, all of which shall be common stock. Such reduction of capital stock shall be accomplished by the surrender by every stockholder of his shares and the issue to him in place thereof a decreased number of shares."

That more than two-thirds in interest of all of the stockholders of said company voted in favor of said resolutions; that all the shares of stock were voted in favor thereof; that the written assent of stockholders to said amendment is hereby annexed.

GREENSBORO ATTORNEY IS NAMED W. O. W. DIRECTOR



Charles A. Hines

Charles A. Hines, prominent attorney of Greensboro, N. C., has been named secretary-director of the Woodmen of the World Life Insurance association, the strongest fraternal insurance society in the world, it was announced at home headquarters at Omaha by De E. Bradshaw, president. The new director fills the vacancy on the board caused by the death of E. B. Lewis, chairman of auditors.

Other changes included the appointment of William Ruess as chairman of auditors.

Hines is 49 years of age and a native of North Carolina. Born in Guilford county, he received his education in Jefferson academy, Elon college and the law department of the University of North Carolina. He was licensed to practice law when 21 years of age, and has been in continual practice at Greensboro since that time.

He became a Woodman in 1914 when he affiliated with camp No. 26 of Greensboro. The following year he became a member of the North Carolina head camp, serving as head consul of the jurisdiction from 1933 to 1935. He became a member of the Sovereign camp in 1917 and was a member of the national law committee from 1929 to 1933, and its chairman at the time of his appointment to his new post.

Hines has been active in North Carolina legal circles for many years. He is a member of the Greensboro, N. C., and American Bar associations, and a past president of the Greensboro organization and now is district councillor for the state association.

His past record of public service includes terms as city attorney of his home town, state senator, chairman of the state board of elections, municipal court judge and emergency judge of the superior court of North Carolina.

In 1929 Hines was awarded the Greensboro citizenship trophy for "the most useful and unselfish civic service to his city" during the preceding year. This award has been made to only five persons in Greensboro.
