QUESTIONS ANSWERED REGARDING COUNTY LIQ-UOR CONTROL MEASURE

(Continued from page one) the board?

A. By operation of a testing aboratory and hiring of experts to run it.

Q. Can the State Board of Alcoholic control regulate the numper of stores opened to sell liquor n each county?

A. The measure provides that a iquor store may be opened in the county seat and that opening of other stores must be approved by he State board.

Q. What qualifications must a person have to serve on the State board?

A. They must be men wellnown for their character and ousiness success. No member may have any interest in distilleries of quor companies.

O. How will the board membe s be selected?

A. By appointment by the govrnor.

Q. How many persons will serve on the county board of alcoholic ontrol?

A. Three men selected in each ounty at joint meeting of the board of county commissioners, the ounty board of health and the county board of education.

Q. What will happen to the nembers of the boards supervising iquor stores opened under the Pasquotank law?

A. Their terms will expire on une 30, 1939.

Q. What salaries will the mempers of the county boards receive?

A. The body electing the members shall establish the salaries or the board members. It shall be set to socure the best men available for the positions and shall not be large enough to artract persons unsuited for the work.

Q. What will be the hours of operation of the liquor stores?

A. From 9 a. m. to 9 p. m. daily xcept Sunday, election days and holdays, when the stores shall be closed.

Q. Will any money be set aside from the profits of the store for enforcement of the measure?

A. 

A. No.

Q. Can liquor be carried into a dry county?

A. Yes, one gallon or less, provided that it is not for sale and the cap or seal on the bottle is not broken. The law permits deliveries through dry counties to a iquor store in another county. Q. Can liquor stores advertise n newspapers, on billboards or on the radio? A. No

Q. How will the State benefit financially from this measure? A. After the bill has become a aw, the Legislature plans to pass a measure taxing liquor sales. Moneys from this sale tax will go to the state government.
