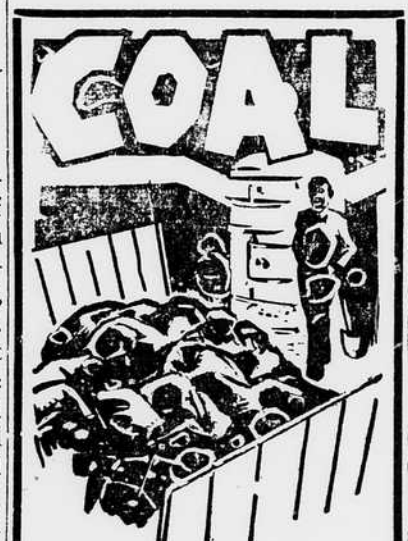
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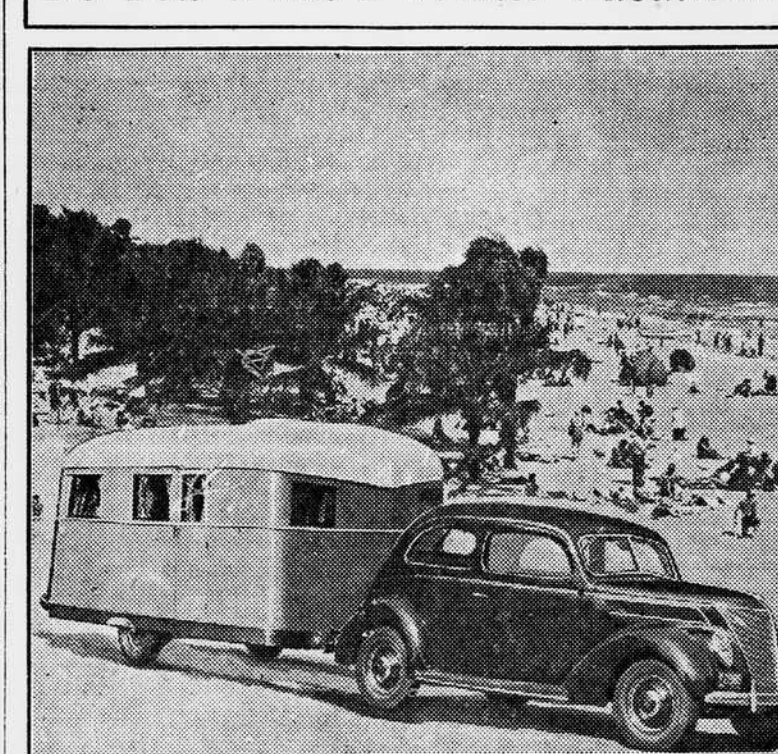

NOTICE OF TOWN PRIMARY

General Municipal election, appointment of Registrar and Judges etc., as provided under the Charter of the Town of East Spencer and the laws of the State.

Pursuant to the provisions of the charter of the Town of East Spencer, and the laws of the State of North Carolina, and a resolution adopted by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of East Spencer on the 1st day of March, 1937. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

- 1. That the general municipal primary election for the nomination of ten candidates for Mayor and Board of Aldermen to be voted for at the general municipal election of the Town of East Spencer will be held on APRIL 24, 1937, provided there are more than ten candidates, and in case said primary election is held, the polls will be open from sunrise until sunset.
2. That the general municipal election for the Mayor and Board of Aldermen for the Town of East Spencer will be held on MAY 4, 1937, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and four Aldermen, and the polls will open on said date for said election from sunrise until sunset.
3. The Registrar will open the registration books on MARCH 20th, 1937, and keep said registration books open between the hours of 9:00 A. M. and sunset on each day (Sunday excepted), until sunset on APRIL 10th, 1937. On each Saturday during the period of registration, the Registrar shall attend with his registration books at the polling place, to-wit: The Town Hall of the Town of East Spencer, for the registration of voters, keeping said books open from 9:00 A. M. to 6:00 P. M. on said Saturdays.
4. That all persons who are qualified to vote at the general municipal election of MAY 4th, 1937, shall be qualified to vote at the primary election on APRIL 24, 1937, subject to challenge as provided by law. April 17th, 1937, has been designated as challenge day. All challenges may be held and heard at this time.
5. That for the purpose of holding said primary and general municipal elections, the polling place shall be the Town Hall.
6. That the Registrar and Judges for the purpose of holding said primary and general municipal elections, have been elected by the Board of Aldermen, and are as follows: REGISTRAR: S. B. Jordan JUDGES: C. H. Gray and W. D. Aycoth
7. That all candidates are required to file their applications with the clerk of the Board by midnight of April 21st, 1937, in order that their names may be printed on the tickets, all according to law.
8. That no person shall be allowed to vote, either in said primary or in the general municipal election, whose name does not appear on the registration books; and no person shall be permitted to register after the closing of the registration books, unless he has become qualified to register and vote between the date of closing the registration books and the date of the election, according to law.

Farm Questions

Answered At STATE COLLEGE

Q.—How much whole milk should be fed a young calf? A.—The amount of feed for first week will vary from six to ten pounds daily, depending upon the size and vigor of the calf. A safe rule to follow is to feed one pound of whole milk for each ten pounds of live weight of the calf. During the second week, the daily allowance can be increased from one to two pounds if the calf's appetite is good and if the animal shows no signs of indigestion. After this, the whole milk should be gradually changed to skim milk at the rate of about one pound a day until all whole milk has been substituted with skim milk.

Q.—Is it safe to put fertilizer in rows when planting garden crops? A.—Recent experiments with fertilizer placement for row crops indicate that it is best to put the fertilizer in narrow bands on each side of the seed. This helps to avoid too great a concentration of fertilizer salts near the roots of the plants especially during the seedling stage. The same results, however, may be obtained by placing the fertilizer in the rows, if the application is made a week or ten days before planting and the fertilizer is mixed thoroughly with the soil. Broadcast applications are desirable when the rows are spaced close enough to require hand cultivation.

Q.—Is there any sure way of preventing mite infestation of the hen house? A.—There is no method of poultry management that will guarantee against the appearance of mites in the house. The best method is to observe strict sanitation and check at least once a week for the mites. If they are found, remove litter and nesting material from the house. Detach the perch poles and scrape away all dried droppings. The interior of the house and the perch poles should then be sprayed with some exterminating remedy such as a combination of equal parts of spent motor oil and kerosene; commercial carbolineum, or coal tar dip. The spray should be driven into all cracks and crevices in the house. The treatment should be repeated if the mites reappear.
