By direction and Pursuant to authority vested in the Rowan County Board of Elections by virtue of an act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, session of 1937, entitled "An act Creating an Agriculture, Breeders and Racing Commission in the County of Rowan in the State of North Carolina and providing for an election thereon," same being Chapter No. 409 Public-Local Laws of North Carolina Session of 1937 an election is hereby called for the County of Rowan to be held on Thursday, the 27th day of May, 1937, between the hours of sunrise to sunset.

The Registration books will be open on the fourth Saturday before said election, being the First day of May, 1937, and remain open for the Registration of voters until the second Saturday before said election, being and including Saturday, May 15th, 1937, and any duly qualified voter may register during said time for said election whose name is not now on the registration books for a general county-wide election; and on each Saturday the Registrars shall be at the regular polling precinct between the hours of 9 o'clock A. day, May 22nd, 1937, the Registrars shall attend at their various precincts with the registration books from the hour of 9 o'clock A. M. until the hour of 3 o'clock P. M. for inspection and challenges as now provided by law, and all the other matters and things required by law are hereby authorized and ordered to be done. On the day of election the polls shall be kept open as now provided by law.

The Registrars shall make due returns of the result of said election to the Rowan County Board of Elections as the law provides. At said election those who favor the adoption of this act will vote "For Creating an Agriculture, Breeders' and Racing Commission," and those who are opposed to the adoption of this act will vote "Against Creating an Agriculture, Breeders' and Racing Commission."

The Registrar and Judges of election heretofore appointed by the Rowan County Board of Elections and who held the General Election on November 3, 1936, and who continue in office for two years from their appointment will hold this election on Thursday, May 27th, 1937, and they are hereby appointed as such Registrars and Judges and authorized and directed to hold the election on May 27th, 1937, and the Registrars are authorized and directed to Register the Voters and perform the other duties herein set forth and as provided by law.

Speaks Under Auspices Of Local Chapter I. R. C. LEAGUE NEEDED Stresses Difference Of Varied Nationalities; Austria Focal Point (From The Pioneer) Sir Herbert Ames, former Treasurer of the League of Nations speaking here last night under the auspices of the International Relations Club, pleased a large audience with his address upon "The Bubbling Cauldron of Central Europe."

Less than a year and a half ago Sir Herbert Ames made an extensive tour of Central Europe, interviewing prominent officials of each country in that region. The speakers knowledge of his subject was clearly demonstrated as he told his avid listeners of the heterogeneous conditions of these small nations, Austria, Hungary, Rumania, and the district that was formerly Transylvania.

After giving the historical background of these countries the speaker proceeded to draw from his stock of personal reminiscences narrating stories of his interviews with such men as the Chancellor of Austria, and the head of the Fascist party in Austria.

Sir Herbert Ames stated that the population and nationality differences of these countries could be settled through the medium of the League.
