NORTH CAROLINA, ROWAN COUNTY

By direction and Pursuant to authority vested in the Rowan County Board of Elections by virtue of an act of the General Assembly of North Carolina, session of 1937, entitled "An act Creating an Agriculture, Breeders and Racing Commission in the County of Rowan in the State of North Carolina and providing for an election thereon," same being Chapter No. 409 Public-Local Laws of North Carolina Session of 1937 an election is hereby called for the County of Rowan to be held on Thursday, the 27th day of May, 1937, between the hours of sunrise to sunset.

The Registration books will be open on the fourth Saturday before said election, being the first day of May, 1937, and remain open for the Registration of voters until the second Saturday before said election, being and including Saturday, May 15th, 1937, and any duly qualified voter may register during said time for said election whose name is not now on the registration books for a general county-wide election; and on each Saturday the Registrars shall be at the regular polling precinct between the hours of 9 o'clock A. M. and sunset. And on Saturday, May 22nd, 1937, the Registrars shall attend at their various precincts with the registration books from the hour of 9 o'clock A. M. until the hour of 3 o'clock P. M. for inspection and challenges as now provided by law, and all the other matters and things required by law are hereby authorized and ordered to be done. On the day of election the polls shall be kept open as now provided by law.

The Registrars shall make due returns of the result of said election to the Rowan County Board of Elections as the law provides. At said election those who favor the adoption of this act will vote "For Creating an Agriculture, Breeders' and Racing Commission," and those who are opposed to the adoption of this act will vote "Against Creating an Agriculture, Breeders' and Racing Commission."

The Registrar and Judges of election heretofore appointed by the Rowan County Board of Elections and who held the General Election on November 3, 1936, and who continue in office for two years from their appointment will hold this election on Thursday, May 27th, 1937, and they are hereby appointed as such Registrars and Judges and authorized and directed to hold the election on May 27th, 1937, and the Registrars are authorized and directed to Register the Voters and perform the other duties herein set forth and as provided by law.

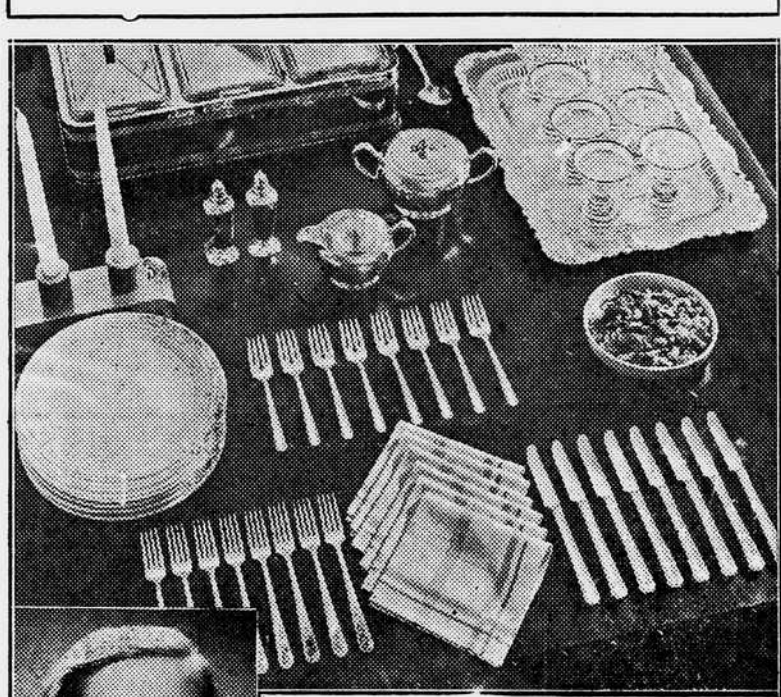

THE HONEYMOON HOUSEWARMING



Peggy Tudor, Expert on Problems That Confront the Hostess, Tells How to Place Silverware for a Buffet Supper

THE first party in the new home that shall it be... a luncheon, a dinner, a tea, a buffet supper? The last-named is much the most practical for the new housekeeper. It will give you a chance to show off your gleaming silverware, and the new china and sparkling glass you're so proud of. After all, what's prettier than a buffet set for a supper? And what's more satisfying, even for the experienced hostess, than knowing she is free to devote all her thoughts to giving her guests a good time while serving problems solve themselves?

How quickly people get acquainted, and what fun they have, when you turn them loose in front of platters heaped with good things to eat—salads, cold meats, tiny sausages sizzling hot, buttered rolls, tantalizing sandwiches, olives and nuts, coffee, all the good things which stand for hospitality with a big H! I shan't attempt to plan your menu, but let it be a simple one. It's table settings I want to talk about. Naturally, the minimum amount of silverware with which a bride can start housekeeping is a simple twenty-six-piece service. This includes six knives, six forks, half-a-dozen dessert spoons, the same number of teaspoons, a butter knife and a sugar spoon. This does not mean a great expense, for silverware may be purchased in deliciously charming as the most sterling. Many women actually prefer such a trousseau service to the responsibility of solid silver. The first thing in planning your table is to make it dramatic! Look at the setting above. The silver, planned for a hot dish, like a big platter of spaghetti; a cold salad (tomato aspic with canned lobster it is delicious); cheese and crackers, and coffee—all have been arranged to make a striking design on the cloth. If you have one of the stunning new linens in a dark shade like mulberry, so much the better. Use blue candles and blue napkins for contrast. Coffee spoons are not placed on the buffet, as they are served with the coffee itself. Otherwise your table is complete. Another thing, if your honeymoon housewarming is taking place in a dining room, simply set up a card table against one wall. It makes an excellent buffet for serving purposes, and the same attractive table setting can easily be arranged on it.

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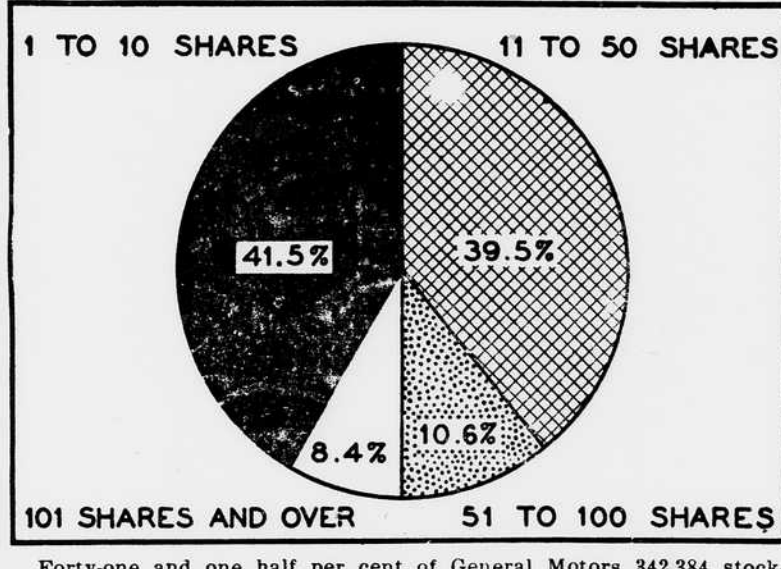
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41.5% of General Motors Owners Have 10 Shares or Less
