REPORTS OF THE PRESS ASSOCIATION.

RICHMOND, Jan. 11.—The Examiner of the morning states that Butler has been relieved of his command and ordered to report to Lowell, Massachusetts, his place of residence.

Gen. Ord has been assigned to command the army of the James.

RICHMOND, Jan. 11.—In the Senate, Mr. Watson submitted a preamble and joint resolutions which were agreed to, requesting the President to appoint a day of fasting, humiliation and prayer.

In the House Mr. Willis offered a resolution declaring all attempts to make peace with the United States by a coalition or intervention of separate States, compelling the Confederacy, unauthorized by the constitution and in contravention of the supreme law of the land, therefore, revolutionary.

The Senate bill to provide payment and interest on the removal and subsistence fund due the Cherokee Indians in North Carolina passed.

RICHMOND, Jan. 10.—The House passed the consolidation bill to-day—yeas 43, nays 38.

RICHMOND, Jan. 10.—Mr. West of Missouri, recently appointed Senator, appeared in his seat to-day.
