A PROCLAMATION,

By his Excellency David S. Reid, Governor of the St te of

North Carolina. WHEREAS, three-fifths of the whole number of members of pass the following Act:

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF NORTH CAROLINA-WHEREAS, The freehold qualification now required for the electors for members of the Senate conflicts with the funda-

mental principles of liberty; Therefore,
Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the
State of North Carolina, and it is hereby enacted by the authorsty of the same, three-fifths of the whole number of mem-bers of each House concurring, that the second clause of third section of the first Article of the amended Constitution ratified by the people of North Carolina on the second Mon-day of November, A. D., 1835, he amended by striking out the words "and possessed of a freehold within the same distriet of fifty acres of land for six months next before and at unchartered Societies, and Obituaries, will be charged half the day of election," so that the said clause of said section shall read as follows: All free white men of theage of twenty-one years (except as is hereinafter declared) who have been inhabitants of any one district within the State twelve months immediately preceding the day of any election and shall have paid public taxes, shall be entitled to vote for a member of the Senate.

SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, That the Governor of the State be, and he is hereby directed, to issue his Proclamation to the people of North Carolina, at least six months before the next election for members of the General Assembly, setting forth the purport of this Act and the amendment to the Constitution herein proposed, which Proclamation shall be accompanied by a true and perfect copy of the Act, au-thenticated by the certificate of the Secretary of State, and both the Proclamation and the copy of this Act, the Governor of the State shall cause to be published in all the newspapers of this State, and posted in the Court Houses of the re-spective Countles in this State, at least six months before the election of members to the next General Assembly.

Read three times and agreed to by three-fifths of the whole number of members of each House respectively, and ratified in General Assembly, this the 24th day of January, 1851. J. C. DOBBIN. S. H. C.

And Whereas, the said act provides for amending the Constitution of the State of North Carolina, so as to confer on every qualified voter for the House of Commons the right to vote also for the Senate.

Now, therefore, to the end that it may be made known that if the aforesaid amendment to the Constitution shall be agreed to by two-thirds of the whole representation in each house of the next General Assembly, it will then be submitted to the people for ratification, I have issued this my Proclamation in conformity with the provisions of the before recited Act.
