The Southern Republic.

We, the people of the Confederate States, each State acting in its sovereign and independent character, in order to form a permanent federal government, establish liberty to ourselves and our posterity...

Section 1. All legislative powers shall be vested in a Congress of the Confederate States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. 1. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several States...

Section 3. 1. The Senate of the Confederate States shall be composed of two Senators from each State for six years...

Section 4. 1. The times, places and manner of holding elections for Senators and Representatives shall be prescribed in each State by the Legislature thereof...

Section 5. 1. Each House shall be the judge of the elections, returns and qualifications of its own members...

Section 6. 1. The Senators and Representatives shall receive a compensation for their services to be ascertained by law...

Section 7. 1. All bills for raising revenue shall originate in the House of Representatives; but the Senate may propose or concur with amendments...

Section 8. 1. The Congress shall have power— To lay and collect taxes, duties, imposts and excises for revenue necessary to pay the debts...
