BY THE GOVERNOR OF NORTH CAHOLINA. A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, it has been made to appear to me that the terms of the Proclamation issued by me on the 26th ultimo, for the benefit of those members of our army who are absent from their colors without proper leave, may not have been known to all who might have desired to avail themselves of its merciful provisions in time for them to do so.

Now, therefore, I. ZEBULON B VANCE, Governor of the State of North Carolina, do issue this second Procla-mation, extending the time limited in the former to the 5th who shall have reported to their several camps by that day, will suffer no punishment for their past delinquinces. To those who shall not have so reported, nothing can be promised except the severest penalties of the military law.

In witness whereof, I, Zubulow B. Vance, Gov-La. ernor, Captain General and Commander-in-Chief, have signed these presents and caused the great Seal of the State to be affixed.
