NATIONAL UNION TICKET FOR CONGRESS. ROBERT F. LEHMAN. CORRESPONDENCE. NEW BERNE, N. C. Oct. 20, 1865.

DEAR SIR: We the undersigned, respectfully ask if you can take the following oath in good faith and sincerity: "I (A. B.) do solemnly swear or affirm that I have never voluntarily borne arms against the United States since I have been a citizen thereof; that I have voluntarily given no aid, countenance, counsel or encouragement to persons engaged in armed hostility thereto; that I have neither sought nor accepted nor attempted to exercise the functions of any office whatever under any authority or pretended authority in hostility to the United States; that I have not yielded a voluntarily support to any pretended government, authority, power or constitution within the United States hostile or inimical thereto; and I do further swear (or affirm) that to the best of my knowledge and ability I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign or domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the duties of the office in which I am about to enter, so help me God."
